Celebration of Bangla Literacy Week-2021 (NCS)



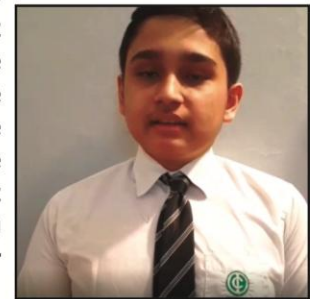

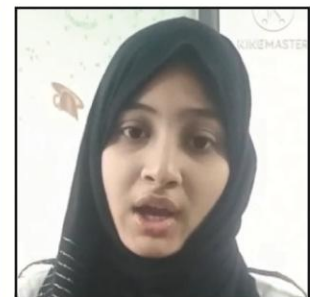
