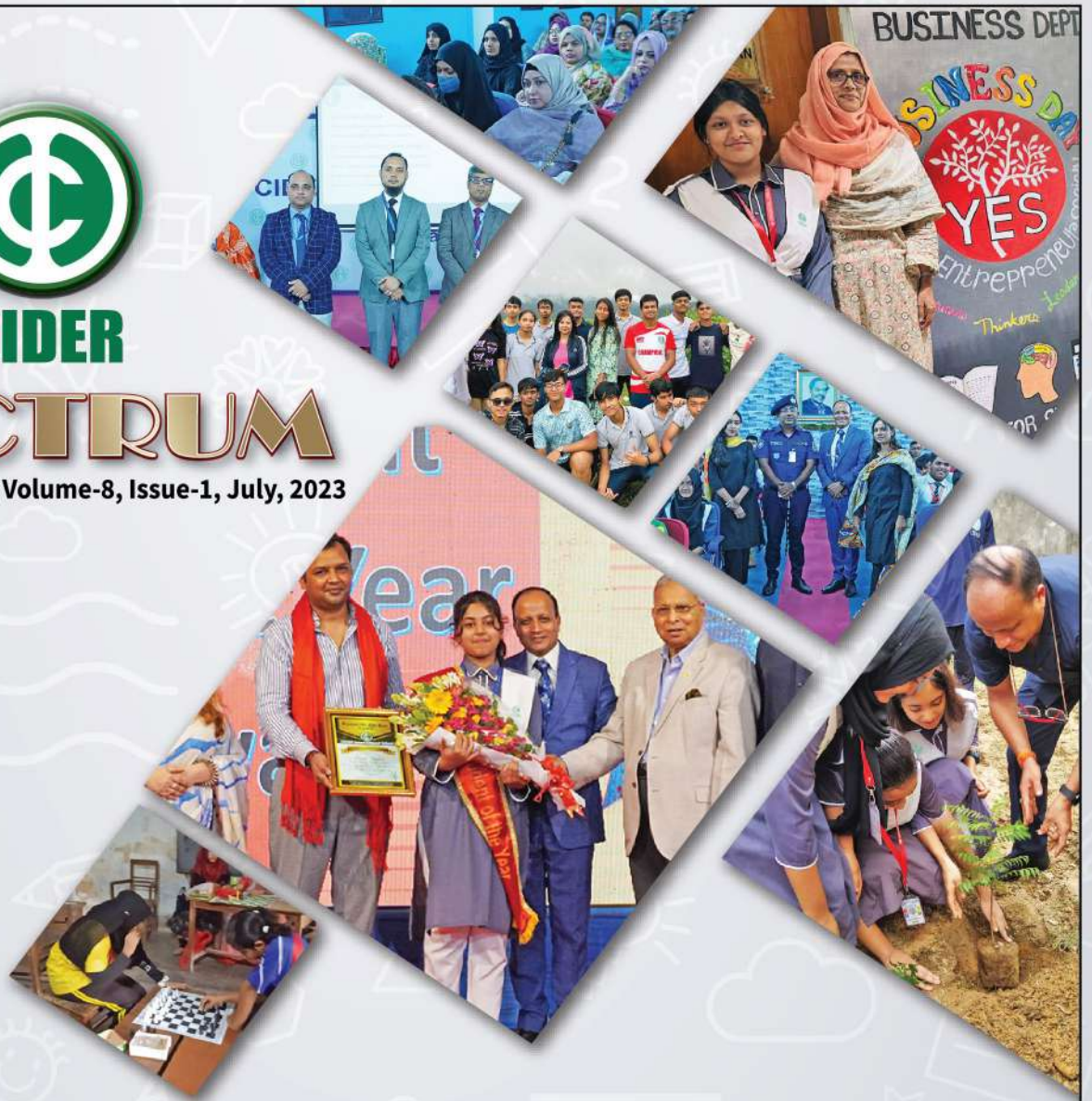

PTM of Half Yearly Examination for Grades (VI-IX) and Pre - Test for Grade X in (NCS)

National Curriculum (Senior Section) organized PTM for Half Yearly Examination (VI-IX) and Pre-test (X) on 15th of June, 2023 in respective classrooms. It was a three ways conference (Teacher-Parents-Student) to identify individual student's area of strength and area of improvement. The PTM was more effective and informative specially for grades VI & VII as their evaluation was completed as per the requirement of new curriculum. In a separate meeting setting parents of those afore mentioned grades were clarified about the new evaluation methodology. This time students of VI & VII received a bunch of evaluation supplementary sheets where their performance level is indicated with subject-wise detail description and students' status is set with three symbols named square (for beginners), circle (for mediocre) and triangle (for expert). A Target was also set for the student's further improvement and to rectify their mistakes/errors. On top of these, grades VIII-X students' evaluation is done in existing procedure. Beside these, answer scripts have been shown and Progress Report Cards have been distributed to the parents. 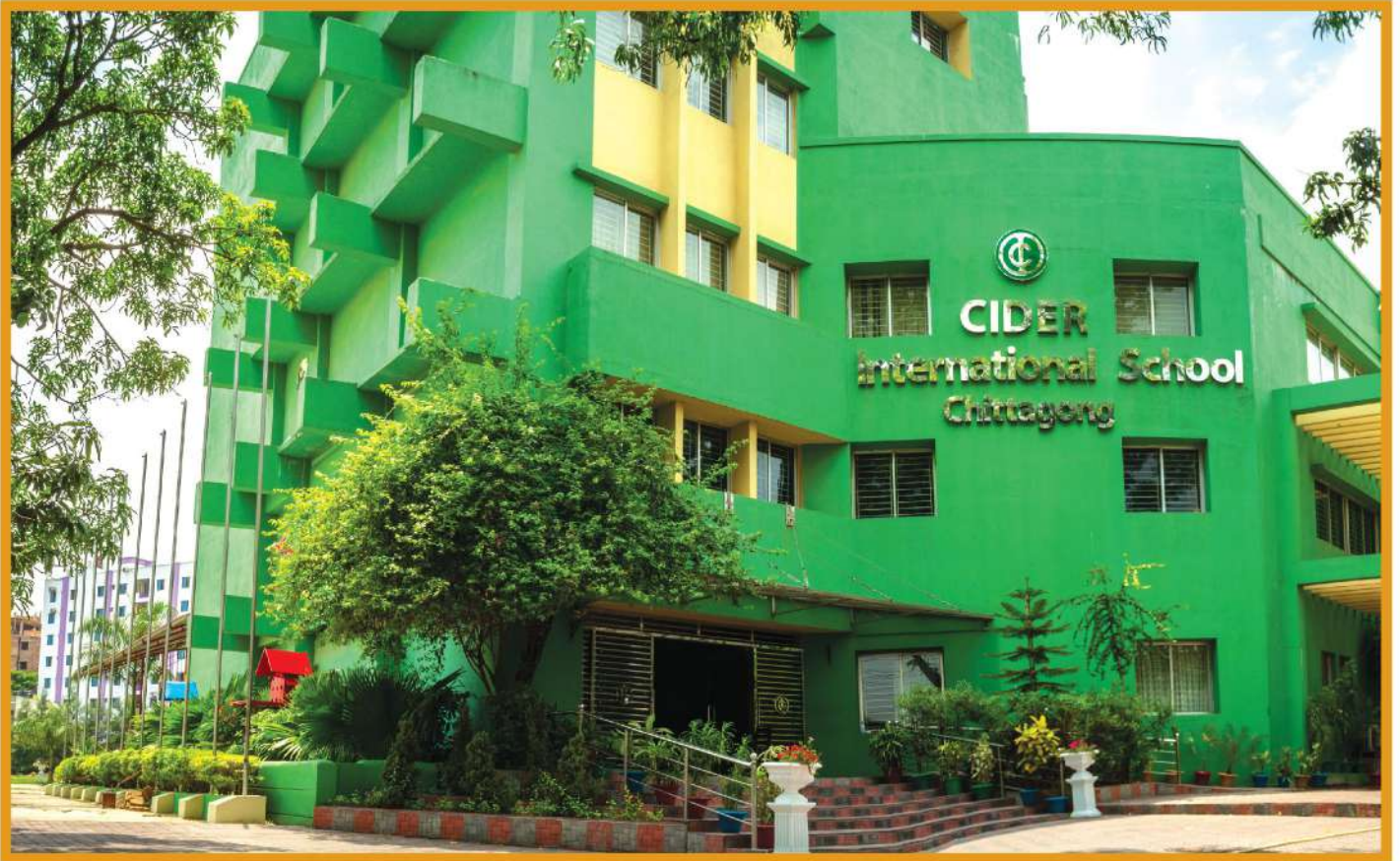
